SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may apply for a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, or may be occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead, for 12.50 per acre, or a quarter section on the homestead or pre-empt one six months in advance of the date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth 1000.

The latter was picked up immediately and medical aid at once summoned, and it was found her injuries to be of a very serious nature. Slight hopes are held out for her recovery.
