LOVE FOR ORGANIST

LADY NOEL'S ROMANCE IS REALLY RECALLED.

Her Niece's Visit to Canada With the Sheffield Choir Recalls an Interesting Story—Jilting of Viscount Campden by Daughter of Novelist.

Lady Nora Noel, who figured as one of the soloists of the Sheffield choir, and whose singing will be recalled by everyone in the audience at Kingston, is a daughter of the Earl of Gainsborough and belongs to a family that has many new world associations. Thus, Lady Nora's aunt, Lady Blanche Noel, the sister of Lord Gainsborough, died in the United States, where she made her home from the time of her romantic marriage with Thomas Murphy, with whom she made a runaway match some forty years ago.

After their marriage, Lady Blanche found the prejudices of her family and of her relatives against her husband on account of his birth too strong to admit of his remaining in England, without being subjected to humiliating ostracism, and so they went to the United States, to seek a new life, and to earn their own living.

Lady Blanche wrote a good deal for the Atlantic Monthly, for Scribner's, for the Catholic Review, and for the Catholic World, etc., yet found time to do all her household work, for she and her husband were too poor to keep even a simple servant.

Viscount Campden, who accompanied his sister, Lady Noel, on her visit to Canada, must not be confounded with the Marquis of Campden, although their titles are pronounced in the same fashion.

The Noels are one of the most ancient houses of English aristocracy, some idea of the antiquity of their family may be gathered from the fact that when in the fall of 1908, Charles Perrett Noel, esquire, of Bell Hall, near Stourbridge, and last male representative of the elder branch of the house of Noel, died, it was necessary to go back to the reign of Henry VIII, in order to establish his connection with the junior branch of the family, headed by the Earl of Gainsborough.

MADE BY MILLIONS.

Plant Reaches High Capacity by Means of Machinery.

Escanaba, Mich., June 3.—More than one-half of all the wooden butter dishes, wooden pie plates and wooden clothes pins consumed on this continent are made in one individual plant here. Its annual output is greater than the production of all other concerns engaged in the United States.

It consumes each year more than 5,000,000 feet of hardwood timber. At the present time the company is making 1,250,000 butter dishes a day. This is at the rate of 290,000 a year. The clothes pin department turns out a round 1,000 boxes of its product daily. Seven hundred and twenty pins are packed in a box, a total of 720,000 a day, or 221,640,000 a year.

Each of the products of the company is made by a special machine, and the butter dishes are cut, molded and stitched in one operation. This machine was designed by Frank E. Lucas, formerly active in the management of the concern. Its perfection was a work of years. Each of the machines is operated by a girl and has a capacity of 40,000 butter dishes every ten hours. Prior to the perfection of Mr. Lucas' invention wooden dishes were turned out with foot machinery in a crude manner. Separate operations were required, and each series of machines was capable of making only 4,000 dishes a day.

BLIND SEE WITH DOG'S EYES. Restores Sight by Grafting Animal's Cornea on Human.

Paris, June 3.—That a person totally blind from ophthalmia even from birth can be made to see by having a portion of a dog's eye grafted on his own, was the startling communication made by Dr. Borsch, an American oculist, in a paper read at the meeting of the French Ophthalmological Society this week.

In the course of his address the doctor explained that as a result of blindness from ophthalmia, the cornea, which is a transparent membrane in the front eye, becomes opaque, and in such a case the only chance of restoring sight is to replace the defective cornea with that of a healthy eye.
