THE TORIES DISUNITED

CHAMBER WILL AGAIN PASS REFORM IT OPPOSES. Lansdowne's Power Gets Severe Setback—Has Misjudged the Spirit and Temper of Modern Thought in Great Britain.

Toronto Star. London, June 3.—The most noticeable feature in connection with the political situation is the extraordinary fashion in which the opposition to the veto bill is petering out.

The truth is that the unionist party is as a house divided against itself. Probably the party would have wholeheartedly united against the veto bill had it been the sole proposal.

At any rate, they have found scant favor in any quarter outside unionist officialdom. Liberals have scouted them as a mere sham, while unofficial unionists, such as Lord Balfour and Lord Willoughby de Broke, who can be relied upon to voice precisely the sentiments of rural Toryism—the kind of Toryism which binds together the squire, the farmer, the parson, and the publican—have been unsparing in their condemnation of them.

Mr. Bourassa has refused the overtures of the conservatives, but he is the ally of Mr. Monk, and they have begun to stir Quebec, one as the advocate of reciprocity and the other as the opponent of it.

Mr. Borden is annoyed because some newspaper correspondent has presumed to forecast his speeches as the chief clerk in the station at Toronto presumes to forecast the weather. Mr. Borden has not suffered any more from precarious correspondents than the average public man.

The Nova Scotia local campaign is now on. In the last house there were thirty-three liberals and five conservatives. It would be better for the province if the opposition were a little stronger, but the people know their men and know how far the opponents of the government may be trusted.

Senator Grady, of New York, has a bill in the assembly which aims to make the newspaper editorial writers sign their articles. The signed article has no particular merit.

While the premier and most of his colleagues are absent from Canada, at the coronation proceedings in England, the Toronto News is preparing the conditions upon which parliament will be permitted to do business when it resumes.
