Persons tendering are notified that tenders will not be considered unless made on the printed forms supplied, and signed with their actual signatures, stating their occupations and place of residence. In the case of firms, the actual signature, the nature of the occupation, and place of residence of each member of the firm must be given.

Tenders are asked for two modes of construction, and each contractor must send in with his tender an accepted cheque on a chartered bank, payable to the order of the Honourable Minister of Public Works, equal to ten per cent. (10 p.c.) of the bids, which shall be paid him if he tender for a period of six months from the date when called upon to do so, or fail to complete the work contracted for. If the tender is not accepted the cheque will be returned.

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
