

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for District, or by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions. If father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of homesteader.

Disturbances—six months' residence and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live with five miles or his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, wholly owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside on the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead, including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has constituted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption must enter for a published homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
