

March 31st to have totalled 117,780, 409; which is the greatest by far the dominion has ever had and is sixteen and a quarter million ahead of This year there is every indication that the revenue will approach a hundred and thirty millions. In the last fiscal year customs revenue

amounted to \$72,965,394 excise, \$16,-869,837 postal returns, 89,146,953; publie works and railways, \$10,818,834, miscellaneous, \$7,979,391. The expenditure on revenue account last, year was \$87,773,998, an increase of eight and a quarter millions. Expenditure on capital account totalled \$33,696,222, a decrease of half a million. During the first two months of the present fiscal year ending May 31st, Canada's revenue was \$18,573,441.
