**ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 15 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.**

**TOWN OF GANANOQUE**

**DEATH OF WILLIAM HAMPTON, AGED SIXTY.**

Boy-Scouts to Attend Coronation Service—School Matters—Visit From Knights Templars, Syracuse, N.Y.

Gananoque, June 19.—William Hampton, a well-known resident of the town, passed away at his home, on Charles street, on Friday evening, in the sixtieth year of his age, after an illness lasting for several months. He was predeceased by his wife a year or more ago. He leaves a grown-up family. Among them are John Almon, Herbert, and Mrs. John Garrard, Mrs. David Butler and Miss Edith Hampton, the latter and Herbert at home. The funeral took place yesterday afternoon, to Gananoque cemetery.

Rev. Father Deering, U.S.S.R., of Toronto, is delivering a course of lectures here in connection with the forty hours' adoration, in St. John's church. Among the priests from the surrounding district giving assistance are Rev. Fathers Spratt, of Wolfe Island, Cullinane, of Trevelyan, and Traynor, of Brewer's Mills.

The Boy Scouts, in uniform, held a fine drill, on Saturday evening, in charge of Scout Master W. C. Ruppberg, at this quarters, Stone street. They are to attend the coronation service in St. Andrew's church next Thursday morning, and will also give an exhibition of drill and sing several patriotic songs at the "Marquee," in aid of the Citizens' band, Thursday afternoon and evening.

Saturday was another big time on the "hog" market, several dozen loads of swine being brought in by the farmers of the surrounding rural district and disposed of to the local buyers.

Miss Butler, of the West ward school, has tendered her resignation, to go into effect at midsummer. Miss Flossie M. Cornett, who just recently completed her Norman course, applied for a situation on lower grade work, and was accepted at the minimum salary, \$400.

Capt. Thomas M. Cornett was the unanimous selection at Delta, on Friday, to fill the position of president of the South Leeds Conservative association, left vacant by the recent appointment of Dr. J. A. McCannion to the Shifvalty. Five other nominees withdrew in his favor.

George Funnell has again started delivering the mail to the summer resorts down the river.

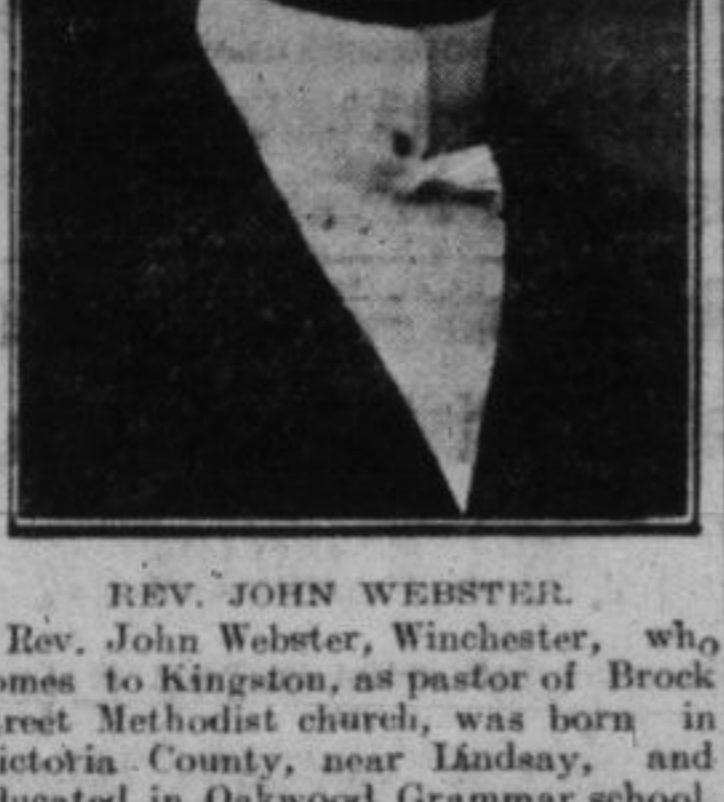
