**CROPS OF CANADA**

In Ten Years Grain Production Has Increased in Value 210 Per Cent.

The crops of Canada last year reached in value the sum of \$532,932,100. Of this amount grain crops made up \$330,492,400. These grain crops have shown an increase in value of 210 per cent. since 1900. Wheat, consisting of both spring and fall varieties, is cultivated from the Atlantic to the Pacific oceans, the largest areas devoted to this class of crop being in the provinces of Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, and Alberta. Oats form one of the principal stock feeds, and along with corn and wheat is quite largely used in the cereal food industry. Barley is one of the grain crops that is rapidly coming to the front. Rye is one of the least important of the cereal grains and its production is chiefly confined to Ontario. Field peas is another of the crops which has helped to swell Ontario's large crop production, about ninety per cent. of this crop being raised in Ontario. The production of the buckwheat crop is greatest in Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick, very little being produced in the Western Provinces. Mixed grains for both grain and fodder production are grown extensively in Ontario and in some sections of both the eastern and western provinces. Flax is largely grown in the prairie provinces, and is used as a feed for stock and for the manufacture of linen. Southwestern Ontario is the section which produces most of the bean crop; the counties of Kent and Elgin supplying nearly one-half of all the beans grown in Canada.

**OUR LIVE STOCK**


Improvement in All Classes is Reflected in Statistics

The live stock of Canada is valued at \$600,000,000. During the year 1910, there were imported into Canada 3,227 pure-bred horses. Of these, 1,985 were of the draft breeds, and 492 of the light legged sorts. Not only in this way is our horse stock rapidly improving, but it is increasing at a reasonably rapid rate, the gain, from 1907 to 1910 being nearly 30,000 head.

The increase in 1910 in the value of cattle was \$27,000,000. The improvement is reflected in the increase of trade at Toronto and Montreal where the cattle marketed shows a decided improvement in numbers, and a better finish. The increase of trade in cattle at Toronto alone in 1910 over 1909 amounted to 34,539 head.

The estimated increase in the value of sheep in Canada in 1910 over 1909 amounts to \$84,000.

Statistics show that the swine population of Canada in 1910 was more than 600,000 short of 1907. It was also less than in 1909 by an estimated valuation of \$7,844.



**CANADIAN SALT WELLS**

The Total Daily Output is Estimated at Nearly 3,000 Barrels

There are about a dozen salt producing plants throughout the Dominion, having a total capacity approximately of 3,500 barrels a day and employing 220 men. The total investment is approximately \$965,600. The following are the chief Canadian wells:

and fish products taken by Canadian fishermen during the year 1909, 1910 was \$29,629,169. This sum constitutes a record, being the highest yet reached during any one year in the history of the Canadian fisheries. It is \$4,178,084 ahead of 1908-09, and \$149,467 better than the total of 1905, which was the best previous record.

This result was obtained by a fishing fleet of 1,750 vessels, steamers and tugs, 37 of which were engaged in fur-seal hunting, and 41,176 boats, the whole being manned by 65,663 men.

**ATHLETIC SUPPLIES**

Large Number of Canadians Employed in Making Sporting Goods

The manufacture of athletic supplies occupies the attention of a large number of workmen in Canada. There is, for instance, the making of canoes, which has made Peterborough famous, with its three large factories, and there are other factories in Fredericton, Gravenhurst, Penetanguishene, Lakefield and Toronto. Snowshoes are made in Quebec alone, but six factories in various parts of that province are engaged in their manufacture. Tennis racquets are made at Niagara Falls; the English game of cricket still has sufficient hold on the affections of Canadians to support a factory which makes cricket bats—as an adjunct to the manufacture of baseball bats. The industry of sporting goods manufacture has ramifications which connect it up with almost every other industry in the country.

**THE PORCUPINE CAMP**


An Area of 216 Square Miles Has Been Staked

During the past year the Porcupine mining camp has come into prominence. Practically six whole townships have been staked out and are held as claims. This is an area of 216 square miles. The townships staked out are: Tisdale, Mountjoy, Whitney, O'Brien, Deloro and Shaw. Gold showings have been found in all these districts but none of them have attracted the attention or justified the excitement as much as the discoveries in the vicinity of the Dome, the vicinity of Hollinger, the Rea Mines property and the northeasterly portion of the same township—Tisdale.

**THE APPLE TRADE**

A Canadian Industry That is Assuming Large Proportions

Ontario is the chief producing province of Canada, though the production in the Otagoan Valley, British Columbia; St. John Valley, New Brunswick, and the Annapolis Valley is increasing rapidly. The plantings in some sections of Ontario are increasing very fast. The Survey Report of the Department of Agriculture for Northumberland County, 1910, gives approximately 10,000 acres for that county alone, fully half of which have not yet produced a crop. Norfolk County is perhaps the best known of all and has made her reputation all within the last six years. Seven years ago she produced practically no first-class fruit at all, but this past season she produced more than 35,000 barrels of good fruit.

Figures Showing the Marvellous Development of Railway Traffic

The number of persons employed on Canadian railroads is about 140,000, their total wages last year being over \$67,000,000.

The railways of Canada on June 30 last owned 4,071 locomotives, and 132,681 cars. Of these nearly 120,000 were freight cars. The freight cars have risen rapidly in number since the days of car famines, some seven or eight years ago. In 1907 there were 107,000; in 1908, 115,700; in 1909 there were 117,700; and in 1910, 119,700. Of the freight cars nearly 5,000 were box cars; over 20,000 were flat cars, and over 12,000 were coal cars.


