NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT I have transmitted or delivered to the persons mentioned in sections 8 and 9 of the Ontario Voting Act, copies required by such sections to be transmitted or delivered by the last revised government Roll of the said Municipality to be entitled to vote in the said Municipality at the next session of the Legislative Assembly, and at Municipal Elections; and that the said list was first posted up at my office, at Pittsburg, on the 1st day of July, 1911, and remains there for inspection.

Persons are called upon to examine the said list, and, if any errors are found therein, to take immediate proceedings to have the said errors corrected according to law.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family may make out 16 years old a homestead in any section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, the premium being apportioned between the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, or certain conditions by telephone, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intended homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land for each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 60 acres, or within 12 miles of a town or village, or within 15 miles of a railway station.

A homesteader who has obtained his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a homestead in any other district.

Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
