



WENT TO PETAWAWA

MEMBERS OF R.C.H.A. LEFT FRIDAY MORNING.

Given Royal Send-off by Band and Their Many Friends at the Station—One Hundred and Thirty-two Men in the Party.

With the band playing "Auld Lang Syne," and a large crowd wishing them a safe journey, and a fine camp, members of the R.C.H.A. left the Kingston and Pembroke railway station, shortly after nine o'clock, on Friday morning, via a special train, bound for Petawawa.

Municipal Ownership.

St. Thomas Times. The greatest municipal enterprise in the world is nearing completion in Los Angeles, where the city has undertaken to bring pure Mountain water a distance of 250 miles in sufficient quantity to supply a city of 2,000,000 inhabitants.

It is the gravity system throughout, no pumping plants being required. It will deliver 258,000,000 gallons (net) every twenty-four hours into reservoirs located nearly 100 feet above the city.

It consists of ninety-eight miles covered concrete conduit, forty miles uncovered, twenty-one miles of open canal, twelve miles of inverted siphons, forty-three miles of tunnels, ten and thirteen feet in diameter; four reservoirs along the line holding three months' supply. Bonds issued for \$23,000,000. Total cost will be safely under Chief Engineer Mulholland's estimate.

In addition, the water power will be utilized in producing 1,200 h.p. peak load, of electrical energy, sale of which will take care of bonds and interest of both the aqueduct and the electrical plant.

GIVEN FIVE YEARS.


Seventeen-Year-Old Lad Stole Four Bicycles.

CLERGY CHANGE

MARRIAGE FORM.

Objections Were Raised to Certain Phrases in Ceremony.

London, July 13.—It has long been suggested that the form of marriage service of the Church of England is unsuitable to present-day decorum in speech, and at last action has been taken by the Lower House of Convocation at a meeting held in the Church House at Westminster.

It was suggested that one clause should be altered to read:

"It is not by any to be taken in hand immodestly, lightly, or wantonly, but reverently, discreetly, advisedly, soberly and in the fear of God."

"There is a great deal too much prudery about in the twentieth century," said Canon Rhodes Bristow in opposing the proposed alteration.

Canon Henson, supporting the proposal, said prudery was a bad thing, but the sixteenth century, from which this particular exhortation came, was a coarse age. After discussion, the alteration was agreed to.

There was a keen debate on the proposal to modify that part of the marriage exhortation which describes the first cause for which marriage was ordained. A committee recommended that the clause should begin:

"It was ordained for the increase of mankind;" instead of "it was ordained for the procreation of children."

The Archdeacon of Birmingham said he did not think the inclusion of the word "procreation" was at all effective. To a large number of persons it was widely offensive, and, as a priest uttered it with hesitation and slurred over it, a great deal of the effect of the teaching which the exhortation was meant to convey, and which he regarded as extremely valuable, was lost.

The committee's recommendation was agreed to.
