THE R. P. FLOWER HOME

KEPT AS IT WAS DURING LIFE-TIME OF HIS WIDOW.

Furniture Has Not Been Disturbed Since Death of Former Owner, and Flowers She Loved so Well Are Carefully Nurtured.

With each article of furniture remaining in the same relative position, as it occupied when its owner was alive, the home of the late Mrs. Flower, at Watertown, N.Y., widow of former Governor Roswell P. Flower, is being kept open, the grounds filled with the same species of flowering shrubs which its owner preferred.

Two or three servants have an easy time looking after the interior, flocking away an imaginary bit of dust from a case or a table and seeing that nothing is disturbed, although the fact that members of the Taylor family are the only callers, and then but occasionally, precludes the possibility of a disarrangement of the furniture, as Mrs. Flower would have had.

The servants and the caretaker of the spacious house and grounds have little to worry them, for their work is slight and their worldly wants have been taken care of by bequests from their late mistress, so that each possesses some thousands of dollars.

The home of the former governor is always pointed out to the visitor. It is not an ostentatious place—rather otherwise—its architecture of a simple type prevalent in a large village, but of the St. Lawrence river, as their goal. From that point they will come by boat to the Thousand Islands where they will remain until the first week in August.
