

WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominton land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.
The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intend-Duties Six months' residence upon

within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father. mother, son, daughter, brother or

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead l'rice, \$3.00 per acre. Duties Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months, in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate tifty acres extra A homesteader who ban exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a pur-chased homestend in certain districts.
