

MAKING OF THE CALENDAR.

A Lecture at Queen's University by Deau Dupuis.

Dean Dupuis lectured on Thursday, in the Physics class room, to a good sized and appreciative audience, on "The Making of the Calendar."

He began by showing views illustrating the ancient civilizations of Babylon and Egypt and the position of Palestine and the Hebrews in relation to these. He explained the origin of the month twelve, as used by these ancient people, and showed how superior it is to ten as a basic number for measuring and weighing.

The method of determining the length of the year, as employed by the ancient Egyptians in the orientation of their temple, and the uses of the heliacal rising of the stars were fully explained and illustrated. The reason why these methods were not sufficient was explained in the changes of obliquity in the ecliptic and the precession of the equinoxes.

Then followed a full explanation of the Julian and the Gregorian calendars, and the way in which the latter was derived from the former. This was followed by an elaborate discussion on the introduction of the number seven and of the origin of the Sabbath, or Sabbath of the Babylonians.

The lecture concluded with an account of the ecclesiastical calendar and the finding of the golden number, the epact and the Sunday letter, and thence of the great moveable feast Easter. The audience was delighted to hear the veteran dean on the lecture platform again.
