WEATHER WAS FIERCE

THE MOST SEVERE GALE CAPT. BOOTH HAS MET.

It Was Almost Impossible to Make Landings Owing to the Severe Wind—News of Vessels at the Harbor.

Captain Booth, of the R. & O., piloted the big steamer Kingston into port on Tuesday morning, at 10.30 a.m., just four hours and a half late, says the Toronto Telegram.

"What kind of weather did you have?" asked the Telegram, when Captain Booth had made his way down from the bridge after the steamer was made fast.

"It was the most severe gale I have ever experienced. The gale that swept down the river from Kingston to Prescott travelled at a clip of sixty and sixty-five miles an hour.

One man who had visited the dock about 6 a.m. and waited until the boat arrived, awaiting his wife, greeted her as follows: "Well, old girl, did you enjoy your trip?"
