Toronto Symphony Orchestra. Plans for the concert season are already under consideration, and a special treat is proposed for our city in the shape of an appearance by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. This orchestra, numbering sixty-five players, is the only organization in Canada to-day on a purely professional basis; that is, each member being an artist on his own particular instrument and doing only symphonic work.

The conductor is Frank S. Wellesman, a Toronto musician of world-wide repute. The personnel of the orchestra, besides numbering the best of Toronto's musicians, boasts many members from the Scottish orchestra of Glasgow, the Henry Wood of London, the Pittsburgh Symphony, and many other famous organizations. Up to the present the orchestra has given concerts in Toronto only, except on a few occasions—accompanying the Sheffield choir in Montreal, Toronto and London, and the Edgar choir in Hamilton; but upon the request of many of our musicians the Toronto Symphony will be heard in concert here in the fall providing sufficient local support can be secured to warrant the undertaking on the part of the management.
