The United States postal service has passed through a similar experience. It was running behind many millions a year. The outlook was alarming. There seemed to be no hope of ending the shortages except by cutting off some of the rural mail free deliveries. But a business man took hold-Mr. Hitchcock. He managed the Taft election and proved his ability to do things. In two years and a half the deficits vanished. The receipts in exess of the expenditure have been to late \$2,500,000, and the revenues are still rising. The rural mail routes were not abandoned. No useful service suffered.
