IT IS DEAD AS EVER

THE ANNEXATION CRY IS NOT COUNTEANCED. The United States Editors Demonstrated That the Annexation Cry Was All Moonshine.

HANGMAN ENTERS ETERNITY. Holds Record for Gruesome Work—Executed Six at a Time.

Fort Smith, Ark., Aug. 2.—Within a stone's throw of the usual resting place of men whom he sent to eternity at the end of a hangman's rope the body of George Maledon, who for years served as official executioner of the United States court at Fort Smith, was buried this week.

With Maledon the hanging of men was a business and an art. Few men who fell through the trap of the Fort Smith gallows died of strangulation—it was nearly always a case of broken neck.

With the passing of Maledon there remains in Fort Smith but one reminder of the death dealing machine which from 1874 to 1890 snuffed out the lives of eighty-eight men.

While he served as hangman Maledon twice hanged six men at one time. The trap of the gallows being of sufficient size to accommodate twelve without crowding.

After he was relieved as federal hangman Maledon toured the Indian territory and other parts of the southwest, exhibiting his ropes and parts of the gallows, being greeted by large crowds everywhere.

THE ANNEXATION CRY IS NOT COUNTEANCED. The United States Editors Demonstrated That the Annexation Cry Was All Moonshine.

A large party of American editors, recently in convention at Detroit, are now taking a holiday trip through Quebec and Ontario.

The editors have just been cordially welcomed and entertained at Montreal. Incidentally of course, speeches were made by hosts and guests, and the Montrealers lost no time in convincing the visitors that loyalty to the motherland was never stronger in Canada as it is to-day.

The visiting Americans may have been a little surprised at these earnest expressions of fealty, but their spokesmen in responding made it clear that Uncle Sam's present intentions were of the best.

Amongst other agricultural products, Canadian barley is put on the American free list under the reciprocity agreement.

For years Ontario barley was exported in great quantities to the United States. It was admitted free during the existence of the old reciprocity treaty, and after that was moderately taxed till 1890.

With free barley Ontario will resume her control over that portion of the American market represented by the state of New York and New England.
