The United States Editors Demonstrated That the Annexation Cry Was All Moonshine.

A large party of American editors. recently in convention at Detroit, are now taking a holiday trip through Quebec and Ontario. When hair coming was announced in the Canadian newspapers, some of the latter hinted that the object of the Yankee journalists in crossing the boundary at this time was to stimulate sentiment in favor of annexation. At the least it was rumored they were bent upon "spying out the land" in the interests of the conpirators, supposed to be active of his side, who lie awake nights plot ing ways and means of alienating the dominion from the empire.

The editors have just been cordialv welcomed and entertained at Montreal. Incidentally of course, speech es were made by frosts and guests. and the Montrealers lost no time in convincing the visitors that loyalty to the motherland was never 13 strong in Canada as it is to-day. Anaexation was feared by some neryous Canadians, they intimated but favored by none. The universal aim was to rivet more securely the ties of friendship with their neighbors to the south, but to preserve their staunch allegiance to the new king

The visiting Americans may have been a little surprised at these earn est expressions of fealty, but their belongs to the Canadians for development, and we say to you 'God bless you, and speed you!' Nothing would please us better than to see Canada grow so that in this century she is in population and wealth, and in every other respect, the equal o the United States."

The journalists before departing promised that not a single word favorable to annexation would be written by any one of them. but without exception they all announced their purpose to preach reciprocity until the pact was established on both sides of the border.




