MR. HAULTAIN STANDS FIRM.
A striking figure in the reciprocity campaign is Mr. Haultain, of Saskatchewan, a hero in many political combats, and the one strong man of the conservative party in the west.

The conservative party and press here made much of the defection of Mr. Sifton from the liberal party, but they do not say much about the defection from their own side of Mr. Haultain, and the one loss balances the other. The position of these two men, emphasizes, as nothing else has done so far, the fact that the issue should not have been made a political one, and the fact that so far as some men are concerned the issue cannot be made a partisan one.

Mr. Haultain supported a resolution with regard to reciprocity in the legislature of Saskatchewan, and does not repent of his action. What is more, the resolution in question was the joint product of representatives of the government and opposition. It has been said that this expression of the house was rushed through and that its members had not the time for due reflection upon it. The truth is that when it was proposed the opposition offered to support it, with some amendments. These amendments were made, and then the resolution was unanimously adopted. Its strongest supporter was Mr. Haultain.

The man has since been submitted to all manner of pressure, and for the purpose of bringing about a re-orientation. Mr. Borden met him in the west, and he sat on the platform of one meeting which Mr. Borden addressed. He has not changed his mind, however, as to the expediency of reciprocity, and he has not, as rumour had it, been turned down by his party. He declined office to the provincial executive of the Conservative Association because it passed a resolution with regard to reciprocity which he could not endorse.

Realizing that he cannot be bulldozed into a repudiation of reciprocity, as some weak-kneed or weak-minded conservative members of the legislature have been, some representatives of the party are inclined to become abusive. The Toronto News, which has become frantic or beside itself in this campaign, does not hesitate to say that the vote in the legislature of Saskatchewan was the result of a secret deal between Premier Scott and Mr. Haultain. A secret deal! Here is an insult which Mr. Haultain should be spared. Mr. Haultain has been a clean man in politics, and he stands firm in behalf of the trade agreement because he feels that it is for the good of the province which he serves. When the smoke of battle has passed away he will be one who can rejoice in the triumph of the people.

AFRAID OF THE ISSUE.
What will Sir James Whitney do in this election? That is the question that some people are asking in an anxious tone of voice. Sir James is the big man, politically, in this province. He has behind him a large majority in the legislature. It is assumed that he does not want anything which will weaken his hold on the electors, and it is perfectly certain that if he fought reciprocity with his forces he would be antagonizing many voters on whom he now depends. Friendship for Mr. Borden prompts an active participation in the contest. Self-preservation suggests that he leave it alone.

An Increase Made in the United States House of Representatives.
Washington, Aug. 4.—The home of representatives' re-appointment bill, which passed the senate yesterday by a comfortable majority, increases the membership of the lower chamber from 391 to 423. It is so drawn that no state will lose in representation, but in some cases there will be a decided increase.

ARE VERY STRANGE.

Blind Man Has Eyesight Restored and Sees Women.
Atlanta, Ga., Aug. 4.—G. T. Mathias, a forty-year-old farmer, of Colquitt, Georgia, having been totally blind for fifteen years, had his vision restored through an operation at a local hospital and walked forth to marvel at a strange world.
He was stricken dumb with amazement when first he saw an automobile. A building more than four stories in height astonished him, but most wonderful of all was the modern woman.
Accompanied by a physician he walked up Atlanta's most important street and saw a number of women garbed in fashion's latest raiment. The astonished farmer, turning to his guide, exclaimed: "Well, I'll be—Are those really women? What have they done to themselves? I never saw a woman who looked like that."

FIVE AUTOMOBILES FOR FIRE BRIGADE.

Montreal Board of Control Calls for Tenders for Equipment.
Montreal, Aug. 4.—The Board of Control has taken steps to have the city's fire department one of the most up-to-date in America, the latest being to call for tenders for five automobiles, fire-fighting machines and two of the latest steam pumps. They will increase the efficiency of the brigade by one automobile truck, to haul the aerial ladder; one automobile truck, to haul the 1,200 gallon steam engine; one combination engine, with a capacity of 1,000 imperial gallons; one auto hose wagon, to carry 1,000 feet of hose; one auto wagon to carry 2,000 feet of hose; one 1,000 United States gallon steam pump, and one 800-gallon United States steam pump.
