The shops have been built at different dates and vary accordingly, but as a whole they possess in a marked degree that order and cleanliness which are the most distinguishing features of German factories. This extends to the foundries, where one usually finds dust, smoke and confusion.

Scores of such crucibles go to the making of an ingot of considerable size, and they occupy many furnaces, which are ranged on both sides of the foundry, with the ingot mold in the centre. At the signal the furnaces are opened and the crucibles drawn out and seized by a small army of workmen, who run them down to the mold and pour them in.
