STREET CAR CAUGHT FIRE.

Looked Like Ball of Fire on Ottawa Street.

Ottawa, Aug. 18.—Enveloped in a huge ball of roaring flames, carrying at least a dozen passengers, a Union depot street car came tearing down Sparks street at noon Thursday at a terrific speed, giving the appearance of a monstrous demon threatening to wipe everything in its path out of existence. Such a spectacle has never been witnessed in this city, and those who saw it fairly shuddered, unable to move from fright. There was no time to flee from what looked like a terrible hurricane of livid flames coming down the street. It lasted about fifteen seconds and went out almost as quickly as it started.

The people jumped off while the car was going, but indistinctly, through the rolls of flames, one could see forms standing and crouching on the floor of the car. The motorman himself did not know the car was on fire until a few seconds before it went out. The blaze had subsided before he brought the car to a standstill.
