ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominton land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Furniture, Carpets is person at Furniture, WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within bine miles of his homestead on

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price.
\$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a pur-chased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside aix months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect house worth \$200.00.


