SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 17 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

The applicant must appear in person at the District Office, or by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Five-six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years, homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and cultivated by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead, price, \$200 per acre. Rules must comply with the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead filing including the time required to secure homestead patent and cultivation fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption must either, for a purchased homestead in certain districts, price, \$100 per acre, duties—Must reside on the land for each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.
