Change of Reciprocity. Future attempts at adopting reciprocity treaties, in Mr. Sifton's opinion, must depend on the efforts of the United States. Canada has had many advances in that direction and is now ready to meet the United States on any fair proposition.

Letter on the Above. St. Paul, Minn., Aug. 30.—(To the Editor): The great mass of ex-Britishers and Canadians living in the United States are very much surprised and pained at seeing in the Canadian papers the assertion so frequently made by those opposed to reciprocity with the United States that it would lead to the annexation of Canada.

Relation to England. The only relation which Canada bears to England is that of good will and mutual support. The Canadians manage their own affairs, and from the mother country have only the assurance of her backing in time of trouble or danger.

Going to Canada. The tide has now changed, said the minister. Last year Canada received from the states of the union about 25,000 people, who took up the free lands of the North-West provinces and will become good Canadian citizens.

WANTS TO FIGHT

CHALLENGED—TWO JOURNALISTS IN FRANCE.

Mlle. Goudon Would Now Like to Meet Editor Whom She Calls a Coward—Tribune Over Her Book on Celebrity—Matter Not Ended. Paris, Sept. 4.—The most militant methods of the suffragettes in other countries have been completely thrown into the shade by a young Frenchwoman, who has just challenged two journalists successively to a duel with pistols, declaring that this is the only way in which she can obtain satisfaction for an insult to herself and the cause she champions.

The young lady, who is hardly out of her teens, is Mlle. Josephine Goudon of Toulouse, who writes under the name of "Arrialy," and is a prominent writer and lecturer in the feminist movement. The trouble has arisen out of a book which she has just written, advocating perpetual celibacy for all women.

But the two fair seconds whom Mlle. Goudon dispatched to wait on the writer of the article found that he was well on his way to Senegal. Mlle. Goudon was not to be put off by this, and, as an editorial article supporting the review had in the meanwhile appeared, she turned her attention and that of her seconds to the editor, inviting him to meet her with pistol in hand in place of his absent contributor.

The action of Mlle. Goudon is meeting with universal approval at the League Club in Paris, where the Secretary, Mlle. de Fromenton, declared yesterday that in a similar case she would not hesitate to challenge a male offender.

At the end of September one of the club reception rooms will be turned into a salle d'armes, and one of the best women fencers in Paris has already been engaged by a great number of members to give a daily course of lessons. Both married women and girls have joined the class.
