WORLD'S CONGRESS

THE METHODIST ECUMENICAL CONFERENCE Will Meet in Toronto—Well-known Delegates—Prominent Methodists From All Quarters of Globe Will Discuss Church Problems.

Unique in its composition and also in regard to the wide scope of the religious and sociological problems which will be discussed, will be the fourth Ecumenical Conference of the world-wide Methodist church in Toronto, on Oct. 7th.

The delegates have been selected by prominent churchmen of the Protestant faith gathered from all quarters of the globe.

The conference will take in various branches of that church which, in the British Isles and elsewhere, are not merged as in Canada. Among such are the Primitive Methodists and the United Methodists of Great Britain and one or two smaller bodies.

The Ecumenical Conference is held every decade, the last gathering took place in London, Eng. The name of the conference implies an ecclesiastical council of a universal character but the laic element will be strong in this assembly.

The fourteen sessions will be presided over by laymen, and among such chairmen will be Sir R. W. Perks, Bart. He engineered the million guinea fund by which the church secured a site opposite Westminster Abbey for the headquarters of Methodism. Other lay presidents will be Justice MacLaren, of Toronto, and the Hon. W. Middlebrook, an English member of parliament.

Among other prominent Britishers who will take part in the debates will be the Rt. Hon. Walter Runciman, a member of the British Cabinet, other parliamentarians will be Arthur Henderson, of Newcastle-on-Tyne, Sir George Smith and T. R. Fenwick, of Hull.

Australia sends a ministerial delegate who is well known as a pulpitist, lecturer, educationalist, editor and author. His publications reflect his ardent spirit of imperialism. Dr. Elchett is well known in the Dominion and holds his degree from Toronto University.

The subjects of discussion take a wide range, opening with surveys of Methodism throughout the world and passing on to the place of Methodism in the church universal, its foreign missionary work, its theological heritage and modern methods of Biblical study. Then the programme passes on to a more practical stage, when the will be discussed such subjects as: The Church and Modern Thought, The Church and the Nation, The Church and Social Service, The Church and Men.

The conference will not be entirely masculine in composition. On the tenth day there will be discussed "Woman's Claims and Responsibilities," on which four ladies, two American and two English, will be heard.

The temperance question, the training for the ministry, Methodist literature, union and federation will also figure on the programme, the last word being on the question of co-operation and economy in the use of forces and means.

One of the lay delegates to this Ecumenical Council will be William E. Skinner, who is now in Kingston, and on a visit to his son, E. W. Skinner, of the draughting department of the Locomotive Works.

Mr. Skinner is assistant editor of the Methodist Recorder of London, Eng., and one of the best known of English Methodist local preachers. He has been connected with that paper for twenty-three years. The Methodist Recorder is the oldest Methodist newspaper in the world with the largest circulation of any denominational paper in the world. He is the honorary secretary of the Local Preachers Mutual Aid Association and was president of that organization in 1903.

Mr. Skinner has travelled to preach and speak on its behalf over 60,000 miles at his own expense.

Mr. Skinner was also for more than twenty-five years the superintendent of one of the largest London Sunday schools, the Tottenham Wesleyan Methodist, which had at that time about 600 to 700 scholars and about fifty or sixty teachers and officers.

Burglary at Cornwall. Cornwall, Sept. 14.—L. E. Bailey's jewellery store was broken into last night and several hundred dollars worth of goods carried off. Like the Weiner burglary on Monday, entrance was effected by breaking glass at the rear. The police believe that two burglars were at work and that they are from Montreal.

From Scaffold Into Cellar. Renfrew, Sept. 15.—George Box, a carpenter, engaged in the building of the separate school here, fell from a scaffold into the cellar, breaking two ribs, receiving also ugly wounds on the head. He was attended to by Dr. Murphy who had him removed to his home, where he lies in rather a precarious condition.

Liberal by Acclamation. Welland, Sept. 15.—W. M. Geerman is the only man in Canada elected by acclamation. He is personally opposed to reciprocity, but was nominated by the liberals, under the pledge that he would vote for reciprocity if the election showed that the people of Canada wanted it.

The people of Maine state, are still in doubt as to whether prohibition holds fast.

E. J. Girard, clerk in the circuit court, has been appointed deputy high constable of Montreal.

At Hericourt, France, Aviator Vedrine fell from a tremendous height, receiving injuries which may result in his death.

The Court of Appeal adjudges the directors of the Sovereign bank liable for nearly four hundred thousand dollars on notes.

Strikes are breaking out all over Spain. They are of a revolutionary nature and the government shows signs of grave alarm.

Five Chilean naval cadets were killed on Wednesday by the propeller of a steamer striking and smashing the launch the young men were in.

Albert Woodard, Fulton, N.Y., has lived seventy-two hours with his back broken. The man was injured when he fell from a haymow.

As a result it is believed, of eating ice cream, at the Western fair, London, Mrs. Frank Dagleisch, Chatham, is dead, at Victoria hospital.

A massive laurel wreath was placed on Wolfe's tomb at Westminster, Eng., on Wednesday, the 12th anniversary of the battle of the Plains of Abraham.

Herman Carn, official dog catcher of the city of Denver, received his two thousandth dog bite yesterday.

At Wassel, Germany, a laborer named Zautze, while suffering from melancholia, cut the throats of his wife and five children, with a razor and then hanged himself.

The post of head of the department of politics and economics at Cornell university has been offered to Dr. David Jayne Hill, who recently resigned as ambassador to Germany.

The labor unions of Canada may establish a labor college to be owned and controlled by them, for inculcating technical knowledge and the fundamental principles of political economy.

Dr. Edward Adams, of Toronto, died suddenly on Wednesday, at Port Hope, where he had gone for a few days' outing with friends. He was at present on the Atlantic, homeward bound from England.

Miss Hammond Vail, of New Brunswick, who died at Detroit, on Monday, was buried by the bell boys and maids at the hotel where she was employed. They subscribed enough to defray the expenses.

Dr. Huber, of Quebec, hid several sticks of dynamite in a barrel in the yard at his home. The servant supplied some hot ash on them as the doctor went by. His funeral was largely attended on Wednesday.

Ward Toland, of Burke, N.Y., who was liberated from jail on Tuesday on \$2,500 bail, for smuggling Chinese, and \$500 for stealing chickens for them, was again arrested on a charge of smuggling and held in \$5,000 bail.

Montrealers have been importing girls from Guadeloupe to be employed as servants. This has aroused popular indignation here and on Wednesday the commissary of police presented the embarkment of six girls, who were unable to get on board, the recently created board of industry of New York at its first meeting, decided to establish a firm where "drunks" may be trained to hold seats on the water wagon.

Meagre reports received at Carinto, Nicaragua, indicate a heavy loss of life by the cyclone of Monday on the Pacific coast.
