## DEATH MRS. JAMES McWATERS.

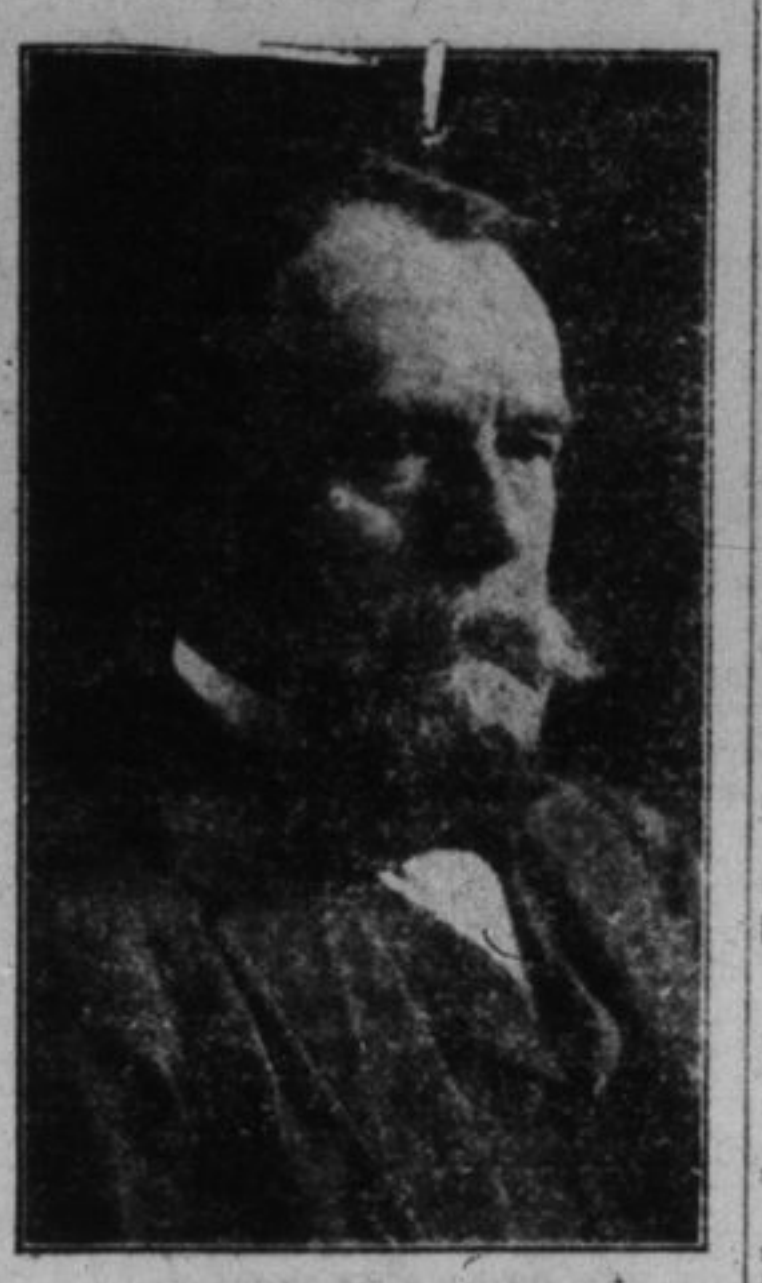
### Had Been Resident of Portsmouth Forty-four Years.
