WHAT AGREEMENT DOES FOR CONSUMER NEWS OF NEIGHBORS

Being Reciprocal it Works Both Ways--Giving Higher Prices to the Producer and Cheaper Living to Consumer.

What is reciprocity? The Imperial dictionary defines reciprocity, applied to trade, as equal commercial rights, enjoyed mutually by two countries trading together. The "reciprocity agreement" now before the electors of the country is an arrangement entered into by Canada and the United States, by which trade is facilitated by permitting United States natural products—chiefly farm products—to enter Canada from the United States free of duty, and Canadian natural products—chiefly farm products—to enter the United States free of duty.
