UNDER CHIEF'S HOUSE

MISSIONARY IS KILLED BY NATIVES.

Elder O. E. Davis Victim of Poisoned Arrows in the Hands of Savages in Northern Brazil.

New York, Sept. 22.—Dr. Henry E. Crampton, head of the department of invertebrate zoology at the American Museum of Natural History and one of the professors of biology at Columbia university, who has been exploring the region about the headwaters for the museum, arrived on the steamship Copennane from Georgetown.

It was Professor Crampton who discovered the murder and who notified the authorities at Georgetown, British Guiana. Dr. Crampton was on his way to Mount Koraima, and stopped at a village, a mere collection of Indian huts, called Kamaria Wong, in Brazil.

The chief of the village, showed him every courtesy but would not permit him to enter a certain hut and it was not until the explorer had reached the town of Tunanumari, in British Guiana, that the Indians of his party told him of seeing the clothing of a white man in Jaramiah's hut which they learned had belonged to a missionary, who had come into the village and had taught the people that plural marriages were wrong.

This they said incensed the members of Jaramiah's tribe and the missionary was hit with a poisoned arrow and as he lay on the ground some one cut his throat. His body was then buried under the floor of the chief's hut and the chief kept his clothing.

Mr. Davis was a westerner about forty-five years old. He had been twice married, his second wife being very much his junior. He married her only recently.

A British expedition will start soon from Georgetown in an effort to recover the body and also if possible to apprehend and punish the guilty natives. Dr. Crampton has been away four months.

The object of the trip was biological survey, which should include a study of the animals, the botany and the geology of the region. Scientifically, Dr. Crampton said that his trip was very satisfactory.

Three times on the trip did Professor Crampton himself narrowly escape being murdered by the natives.

Archibald Blue, chief of the census and statistics bureau, said that a glance at the figures relating to manhood in the district showed that the population of the city of Hamilton, Ontario, whose manufactures have increased more than 100 per cent, since the last census.

Mr. Blue said the cities of Montreal and Toronto would show similar gains.

The census of the Arctic waters was taken by Capt. Bernier, the explorer, who has just returned.

CANADA'S POPULATION

WILL SHORTLY BE ANNOUNCED AS EIGHT MILLIONS.

Large Gains in Quebec—The Western Provinces Will Get Twenty-seven New Parliamentary Members.

Ottawa, Sept. 22.—Canada's fifth census, begun in June, has been completed, and the official figures will be made public within a few days.

The returns show that Toronto and Montreal have been the largest gains in population. The former has the greatest percentage of gain, and the latter the largest gain in numbers.

The gains in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia were confined practically to Halifax and the mining sections. Prince Edward Island has stood still.

All the western provinces show great gains, the largest percentage of the gains being credited to Alberta. The provinces showed many surprising gains, and in the Yukon and Northwest districts had to travel thousands of miles by canoe and horseback and on foot.
