SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years of age and a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 16 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along with his homestead. Price, \$500 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of his three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to obtain homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead rights and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$500 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$1000.

NEXT NAVAL CLASH IN NORWAY WATERS.
So Predicts Prof. Nollen—German Fleet Sounding the Fjords.
Christiania, Sept. 23.—According to Prof. Nollen, the well-known Norwegian patriot, the first naval battle in the world will take place in Norway waters. That is why the German fleet has been so busily sounding the waters in the fjords, in his opinion, and he protests against the freedom allowed to the visitors.

No peace congress can stave off the conflict, he declares, and Norwegians must have an efficient fleet to guard their own interests, and must take care not to give cause of offence to any of her powerful neighbors.

While the professor's views are regarded as unpropitious pessimistic, there is much credence both here and in Sweden, of the Germans being permitted to make themselves at home in Norwegian waters. Some Swedish papers even charge Norway with violating her pledge of neutrality. It is pointed out that in 1896 a similar protest had to be raised, and at that time the Germans did not go so far as to hold part of their shooting practice in the Sognefjord.
