QUEEN'S HELD FIRST PRACTICE SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

Team Showed Up Remarkably Well—Will Practice Again This Afternoon—Russell Britton, of Gananoque, Secured as Coach—Other Sport Notes.

Queen's rugby team held its initial practice on the lower campus Saturday afternoon. The turnout of the members was not large as they are not all here yet, but this was merely an advance workout for the first big one which is to be held this afternoon. For an hour and a half, about a dozen enthusiasts kicked the pigskin over the gridiron to wear off the rust which has accumulated through the winter and summer. N. M. Leskie, captain of the team, was not present, but will be here for the practice this afternoon.

Britton Secured as Coach.

Russell Britton, of Gananoque, a well known rugby authority and former Queen's player, has been secured to coach Queen's rugby team this season. He knows all the fine points of the game, and should whip Queen's into fine shape. With only two weeks before the first game he will have to work mightily hard, but then Queen's has had to do that in other years. It will be time now for Queen's to fulfil the statement made by "Chaucer" Elliott some time ago that if it had a good coach it could make either McGill or Varsity. In the meantime, the team will have to work hard for the first game with Varsity here, on October 7th.

Frontenacs Not Broken Up.

In spite of the statement, made some time ago that the Frontenacs would be considerably weakened next winter on account of the absence of several of the star players, the fact remains that in all probability only one will be missing when the team lines up at the first practice. Leo Millan without doubt will be the absentee if having been definitely decided that he will attend Ottawa college this term. Marchand will go to Hamilton for a couple of months this fall, but will be back here by the first of January. Leo Williams will be able to hold down the goal position any way.
