Tips for Rugby Players.

Here are some tips for aspiring football players, and some of the vets. could probably read them over, too:

A drop kick is usually made by dropping the ball with a slight tilt backwards. When it touches the ground, the toe hits the ball on the underside.

The ball should be dropped on a level spot; keep your eye on the ball after gauging the distance and direction of the goal posts.

In open field tackling, don't run up to the man with the ball. It gives him a chance to dodge. Wait for him. Point from left to right. Puzle him. Then tackle him low.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years at least. Homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section elsewhere in certain districts. Price, \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry, (including the residence at any agency, on certain conditions) cultivate fifty acres extra.
