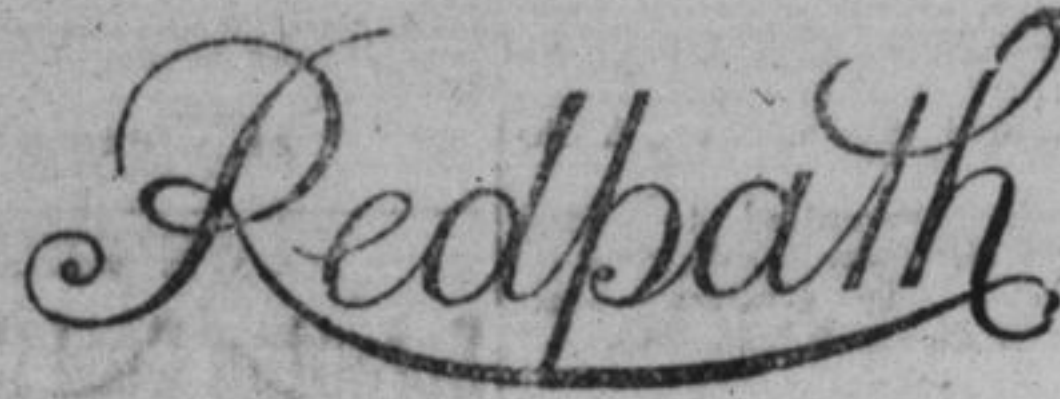

IT CAUSED RABIES WOMAN SLEW A YOUTH

AFTER 20 YEARS' IMMUNITY FOR AN ALLEGED INSULT IN SUPPOSED CASE DEVELOPS. HER HOME.

An Investigation Held—Experiments Are Being Made to Test Correctness of the Diagnosis.

London, Sept. 26.—Not for twenty years has there been a case of hydrophobia in England. The disease was stamped out by a long-continued and drastic law regarding the muzzling of dogs and also by quarantining for three months all dogs endangering the country. The restriction still prevails, but now a case of suspected hydrophobia, resulting in death, has caused a sensation. Mr. Bower, a master of the bounds, was bitten on the hand by a fox at the end of a run at the close of the last season. He did not suffer until a few days ago, when he died. The doctors had diagnosed the case as hydrophobia. It is held that a fox was suffering from hydrophobia. It could only have been infected through being bitten by a dog. No case of a dog having rabies is to be traced.

BETTER PAY FOR PREACHERS.

Some Ministers in Wales Receive \$100 a Year.

London, Sept. 26.—An attempt is to be made to better the condition of the Nonconformist ministers of Wales. The principle of the cause of Nonconformity, but its pastors are poorly provided for.

Dozens live on a starvation wage. Many have to live and bring up their families on fifteen shillings, or \$3.00 a week; others on \$2.50; others on \$2, and some even on less. The committee of the Welsh Congregational Union has taken the matter in hand and is to raise \$250,000 within the next five years. The income from this fund it undertakes to supplement by annual collections of not less than \$10,000, which will secure a minimum salary of \$100 to each accredited minister.

MEXICO TO FEED POOR PUPILS.

President de la Barra Opens First Cheap Kitchen.

Mexico City, Sept. 26.—President de la Barra, today, attended the opening of the first school kitchen in Mexico City. Following plan adopted in New York, the government will provide breakfast and luncheon to the poor children at a cost not to exceed three cents in Mexican money for each meal.

Ten such kitchens are to be opened in the capital. The department of education will work toward the adoption of the same system in the states.

A Southern Man's Wife Declares She Slewed the Young Man for Self-Protection.

Shelburne, La., Sept. 26.—Mrs. J. P. McCrea, wife of a division superintendent of the St. Louis and St. Francis railroad, who shot and killed Alton Gartland, a student in Tulane College, and a member of one of the leading families of Louisiana, could not be shaken in her story that the shooting was necessary to protect herself against the young man.

Twenty-four hours in a cell, where her husband was her constant companion, did not cause Mrs. McCrea to lose any of her composure. Calmly and without signs of emotion she again, and in substantially the same form, gave her reasons for the killing.

CANADA'S NEW PREMIER.

R. L. Borden Was Put Into Politics by the Tupperts.

Robert Laird Borden, Canada's new prime minister, is the first man to attain that office who has not given the better part of his life to politics. He was forty-two years old and a lawyer of standing in Halifax before he entered the public arena. The election of 1896, which brought Sir Wilfrid Laurier into power, gave Mr. Borden a seat in the opposition. He had a legal association with the law firm so long adorned by the name of Sir Charles Tupper, who was prime minister in 1896. Mr. Borden was to enter public life under the patronage of the Tupperts. The conservative government expected to be returned to power in 1896, and undoubtedly Mr. Borden saw ahead cabinet honors and possible accession to the premiership, which he now has won by a longer and more arduous course.

He displaces Sir Wilfrid Laurier, a man who is opposite in nearly every conceivable characteristic. Sir Wilfrid is French, fluent, adroit; Mr. Borden is British, blunt, without the minor political facility, which makes leadership easy. Twice he has been defeated before this campaign brought the great issue of reciprocity, on which the people have chosen to decide against the Laurier government, which has been in power for fifteen years.

Mr. Borden's father was Andrew Borden and his mother Emily Laird. He received his education at Andover, Vt. Academy, at Horton, N.S. As a young man he went over to the United States, as thousands of his countrymen were doing in the lean years after the United States in 1866, derogated the old reciprocity treaty. He was a professor at Glenwood Institute, N.J., but he remained there only a short time, returning to Nova Scotia to study law. He was admitted to the bar in 1873.

In 1880 he married Miss Laura second daughter of F. H. Bond, of Halifax. Mrs. Borden has been of invaluable assistance to her husband's political career and has been generally accorded credit for keeping him in the public arena when he was disposed to lay down the thankless burden of the opposition leadership.
