SPENT PENSION MONEY HOLDING THE FORTS DOINGS AT DESERONTO THE WORLD'S EPISODES

AND HAD TO BE TAKEN IN CHARGE BY POLICE.

TURKS REINFORCED BY THOUSANDS OF ARABS.

MISS E. G. CARSCALLAN WEDDED TO O. J. FITCHETT.

GIVEN IN THE BRIEFLEST POSSIBLE FORM.

An Old Soldier Arraigned Before Magistrate—Police Caught a Man Striking Another on Street Corner—Three Fines Imposed by Court.

Two Dirigible Balloons Sent to Tripoli—Italy Declines Services of Armenians, Albanians and Greeks.

A Lad Fell From a Hickory Nut Tree and Sprained Both Ankles and Wrist—Addition to Car Shops.

Matters That Interest Everybody—Notes From All Over—Little of Everybody Easily Read and Remembered.

Rome, Oct. 3.—The latest word here says that all Italians and other Europeans, except monks and priests, have fled from Tripoli fearing a bombardment, but the Turkish troops, reinforced by thousands of Arabs from the plains, are holding the forts. It is realized here that bloody battles will result from Italy trying to land troops at Tripoli.

Two dirigible balloons with trained aeromeric corps have been sent to Tripoli. The Italian government has declined offers of thousands of Armenians, Albanians and Greeks to go to Tripoli to fight the Turks.

Britain Seizes Turkish Boats.

Owing to another serious outbreak of the foot and mouth disease in Somersetshire, England, the restriction which was removed last week on the importation of cattle, sheep and swine from the United Kingdom into Canada, have been reimposed.

Constables McCay and Downey were given a call to the corner of Brock and Ontario street, at noon on Monday, and they were just in time to see Peter Cunningham strike Patrick Devine in the face and knock him to the sidewalk. Both men were under the influence of liquor and they were taken to the cells.

Cunningham was charged with fighting on the street and Constable McCay told the magistrate about the affair. A fine of \$5 and costs, or six weeks, was imposed, the magistrate stating that it was a most disgraceful after.

Devine was taxed \$1 and costs for being drunk. He said he was attending to his own business and not interfering with any person when Cunningham came along and struck him. The constables did not see him strike a blow.

Clarence Therrien, while gathering hickory nuts, had the misfortune to fall from the tree, spraining both of his ankles and his left wrist. He is getting along nicely but will be confined to his home for a few weeks.

A former resident passed away in Toronto last week, in the person of Mrs. Shane, she having left here about three years ago to reside in Toronto.

While there were indications last night that shelling might begin this morning there has been no official confirmation of the statement that it has actually commenced. In view of Turkey's plainly pacific attitude, it is doubted here if a shot will be fired from the ships of Italy until some manifestation on the part of Turkey.
