SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over is years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, and the Yukon. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made, but only under certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

During three months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within ten miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres entirely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or

sister, or by his wife, if she is a widow.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$100 per acre, to be paid in rent on the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry. Including time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead rights and can obtain a pre-emption may apply for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside on the land each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
