OUTBREAK OF SCARLET FEVER.

The closing of one school indefinitely accentuates a condition which is to be lamented. There is no disease more contagious than scarlet fever, and no disease which is harder to stamp out when it has got a start. It may become epidemic.

Some one, and perhaps some doctor, has been very much at fault in not adopting all the precautions which education and experience can suggest. The danger with scarlet fever lies with the recovery of the patient, and it is quite evident now that Victoria School was entered by a pupil that should have been kept at home. Perhaps the attack was light, but its presence must have been known to the mother, and she, and her physician, if she called one in, merit the censure of the community for their carelessness.

The defect of the Public Health Act is that it provides precautions against disease—and preventative are better than cures—but not penalties. There should be some way of making indifferent people, and especially parents, respect the welfare of others. It is a wicked thing to let any child enter a school and scourge it as some one has done in this case. The Health Department should exhaust every means at its command to locate the family from which the contagion proceeded and fix the responsibility where it belongs.

AN ABSURD PROPOSITION

There is great force in the argument of the Ottawa Free Press, that if the new government is ready to economize it can do better than cut out the advertising, which is given to government papers and as a species of harmless patronage. The Whig does not approve of the Montreal Star's proposal—that the advertising should be discontinued, and that tenders for public works be invited by circular letter. This reminds one of village life, and Canada was supposed to be getting away from it.

The public journal is the place for a public advertisement, and no sensible man accepts the Star's theory that the paper is affected editorially by the advertising it receives. The Whig can say this freely, since it is not in favour at either Toronto or Ottawa, and does not look for advertising from the present provincial or federal governments—unless party lines are to be no longer recognized, as a conservative paper urged not long ago, and before there was the prospect of a change of government.

The Free Press sees the opportunity for public gain in a revision of the

postal tariff, so that the papers which deluge the mails, and practically claim free distribution, while they cut rates, may be called to time. The mails are being imposed upon by some cheap newspapers, and there is a call for reform. The postmaster-general found that the magazines and the papers were imposing upon the United States to an extraordinary extent, and set about applying a corrective. The deficit last year was \$17,000,000. Within a few months by a readjusted tariff, he replanned it with a substantial surplus.

There is room for improvement in the postal department of Canada, and if the publishers that sell their papers abroad for a third of what they collect at home are made to pay their due the government will be able to do its advertising without any appeal to charity. The Star's idea—that the papers should advertise for the government gratuitously—is absurd. The paper which lives by its advertising, has no more occasion or right to advertise for the government freely than it has to advertise for the merchant, and without this advertising the average paper could not live.

THE MOSLEM FEELING
IS THE REAL DANGER OF THE PRESENT WAR.

Sir William Ramsay Discusses the Position of Turkey—What of Britain and Suda Bay?

London, Oct. 10.—Sir William Mitchell Ramsay, professor of humanity at Aberdeen university, and a leading authority on Turkish affairs, in a statement just issued, says in part: "Through the war the greatest danger in Turkey itself will be the excitation of Moslem feeling. There is only one strength in Turkey, and that is the latent strength of fanaticism. On that force Turkey must depend in case of war, and if it develops it will show itself in massacres, sporadic or worse. The process of Turkish massacres is always the same. The evils and misfortunes that might result are incalculable."

"A dignified protest against oppression is the best policy—the best for Turkey and the worst for Italy. It is hard to see how Turkey can gain anything from any other course. The odium of aggression would then rest on Italy and the burden of an Arab war could not be broken off. In this way the breaking up of Turkey may be delayed, whereas by war it must be accelerated, but in the meantime there will be much trouble, disturbance, riot, and perhaps massacre. No Italian will be safe, and the Turks do not readily distinguish between one European and another. If such murders begin they cannot be permitted, and there will come the end of Turkey."

"The first step in the breaking up of Turkey was made by the Russo-German railway agreement last winter. The second is made by Italy, a member of the triple alliance. The second step has been made without the consent of Germany."

"It is not clear to what events are tending. Their prey is there, and the eagles are gathering. Another question intrudes itself. It must have been clear to those behind the scenes that trouble was impending. Is not the appointment of Lord Kitchener in Egypt connected with apprehension of troubles ahead? Suda Bay, in Crete, is one of the finest harbors in the world, and of immense consequence in the Levant. Is Great Britain likely to allow it to pass under any other combination when Turkey breaks up?"
