THE SPORT REVIEW

"KEN" WILLIAMS ELIGIBLE TO PLAY WITH ARGONAUTS.

The Montreal Herald says the Interprovincial hockey union is dominated.

Mathewson's Great Record as a Pitcher—Duke of Connaught to Attend 'Varsity-Ottawa College Game at Capital.

The Argonauts and T.A.A.C. will play a Toronto city rugby championship game on Thanksgiving day. Smirlie Lawson has turned down the Ottawa proposition and the Oarsmen are after him hot foot.

Hamilton fans are in the highest of spirits over the 'tgar game against Ottawa last Saturday, and they cannot see anything to it but Big Four and Dominion championship.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught has accepted an invitation from the Ottawa university athletic association to attend Saturday's football game at Varsity Oval between the Toronto, Varsity and Ottawa College teams.

It has been practically decided to build a race-course on the Port Maitland side of the Fraser River, B.C., with a mile track, to cost about \$200,000. The Westminster Thoroughbred association of New Westminster is behind the project.

"Jack" Ryan has returned to Ottawa from Hamilton and appears all right after his accident last Saturday. He did not get out of the hospital till Sunday night. It is still doubtful whether he will be able to play next Saturday against Argonauts.

Mark Toome, the well-known hockey goal-keeper, will have charge of a team in Cleveland this winter. Mark gives it as his opinion that the reduction of the team to six men in the N.H.A. will result in a faster game, making an improvement from the spectator's viewpoint.

Toronto News: They must be very keen on lacrosse in the British Columbia region when they can hand out offers of \$20,000 for one player, which is the amount that Quercy, of the Tseumehs, is said to have had hung up for him if he will take charge of the Victoria team next year.

Ottawa Citizen: Interviewed after the—no, it wasn't a game—Marty Walsh declined to speak for publication. "I didn't see any match," commented the Ottawa coach. "It was just a series of Hamilton scores and kickoffs at centre. As far as I could see the officials spent most of their time carrying the ball back to the midfield."

Mathewson, since reporting to the New York Giants' array in 1910, has pitched just 429 games for his people, with 289 victories, attached against 131 defeats. His average through eleven years of mainstay work stands 687, and when it is remembered that his first three years involved winning with a tail-end team the data flashed above can be better appreciated.

"Williams is eligible to play with Argos," said President Wright, of the Interprovincial. "When he was transferred to Montreal he asked me, and I ruled that he was O.K. That rule was made to prevent the importation of players during the series. Williams was a home-fide resident of Toronto for seven or eight months and resided here when he played his first game. Then he was moved. He wants to play with Argos, and he is clearly not a football importation."

Queen's Soccer Team Won.

The Queen's soccer team again won from the R.C.H.A. team at Queen's lower campus, on Wednesday afternoon. The Queen's boys were able to repeat their whitewash, as they did not let the soldiers get a score at all, although the latter came mighty near it pretty often. Queen's had about five chances to score between the second and third tally, and at last McKenzie landed a snifty. When the whistle blew for half time, the score stood 1 to 0 for Queen's and at full time, 3 to 0. Queen's were somewhat handicapped by being short two of their best men. The teams:
