A homesteader who has exhausted a homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$1.50 per acre. Duties—Must reside on date of homestead entry (including the time required to cure homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 40 acres not yet owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside on date of homestead entry (including the time required to cure homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
