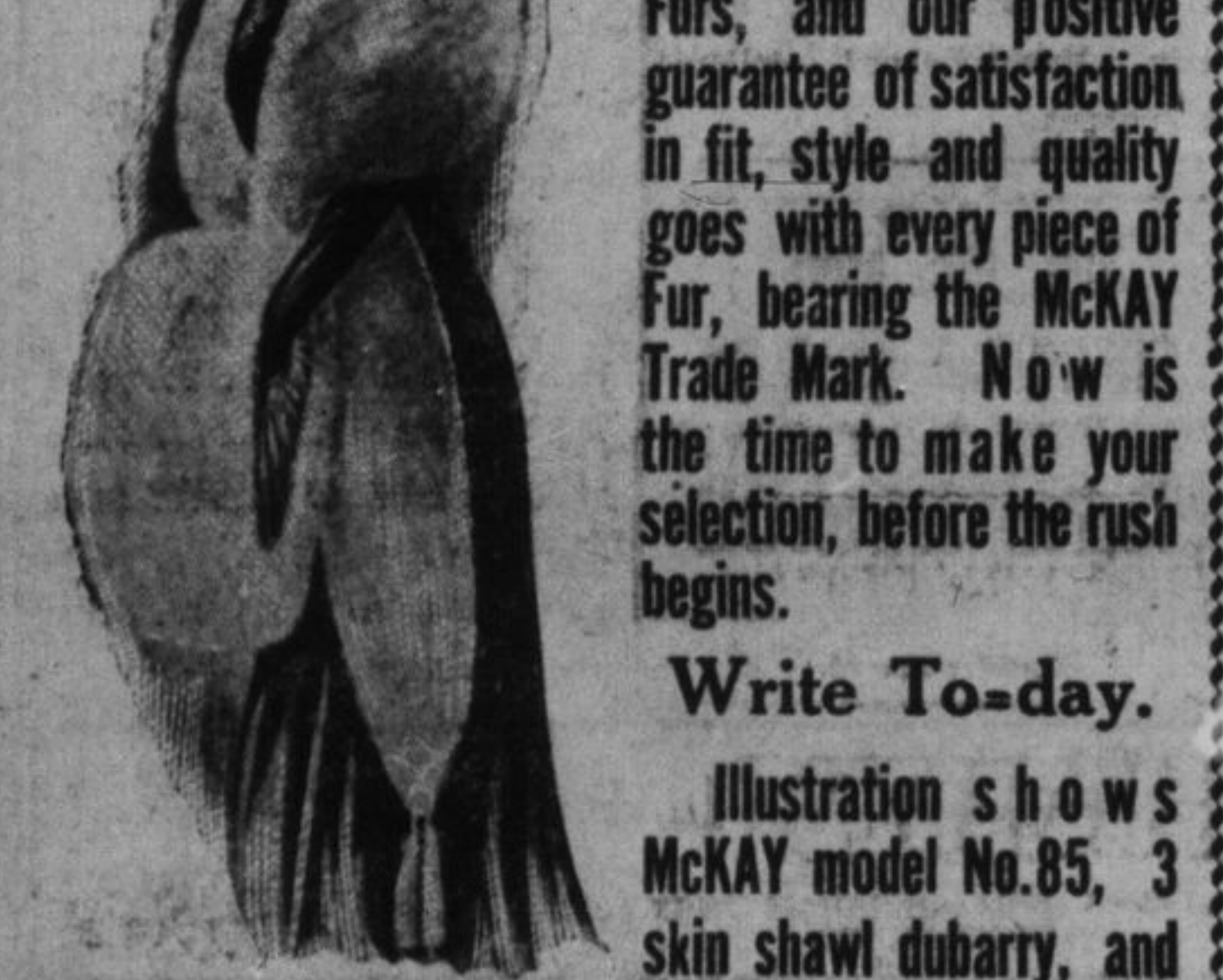

PROPOSAL OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years of age who owns a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-empted six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to farm homestead) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

IN MARINE CIRCLES

OLD STEAMERAGE NORSEMAN BEYOND FIREMEN'S AID.
Is Now Completely Under Water—Will Require Wrecking Company's Services—Movements of Vessels.
The firemen from the lower fire hall took the Chatham engine out to the Grove Inn, Tuesday morning, to pump out the old steamship Norseman, which sank, Saturday. When they arrived there, however, it was found that the vessel was too far under to hope to do anything, so it was abandoned. The water had covered the vessel completely. A wrecking company's services will be required.
