WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over Is years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in danitoba, Saskatchewan of Alberts. The applicant must appear in person at he Dominion Land Agency or Subsections, by father, mother, son any be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son aughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon ad cultivation of the land in each of tree years. A homesteader may live thin nine miles of his homestead on farm of at least so acres solely owned of occupied by him or by his father other, son, daughter, brother or ster,

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must
