He Has Been Active for Years Both in Political and Religious Affairs -A Splendid Leader.

Newton Wesley Rowell was born in Middlesex county, on November 1st, 1867, his father being Joseph Rowell, of London township. He entered upon the study of law in London, and moved to Toronto in 1891, where he completed his studies in law, and was called to the bar the same year. He has been practising law in Toronto for twenty years. He was made a king's ouncil in 1902, was elected a bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada at the last election in May of this


