STORE ROBBED BY GIRL

THIEF, IMPERSONATING AN INSPECTOR GETS AWAY.

Big Department Store in Philadelphia Scene of Amazing Robbery—Suspicion of Cashier Saves House \$8,000.

Philadelphia, Nov. 7.—An amazing robbery was committed by a twenty-one-year-old girl, who, impersonating an inspector in the John Wanamaker store at Thirteenth and Chestnut streets, collected \$800 in cash from five cash registers. With the money in her possession she succeeded in eluding store detectives, who were looking for her, and made her escape.

The robbery was carefully planned, the police declare, as evidenced by the fact that the girl preceded the regular inspector who daily collects the cash by but a few minutes.

About four o'clock Saturday the girl, without coat or hat, made her way to one of the counters. She told the cashier that the regular inspector had been discharged and she would in future make daily collections. With a word further than to ask for a receipt, the cashier turned over about \$80 in bills of small denomination.

The "inspector" affixed the signature "M.H.C." to the cashier's slip, put the bills in a small tin box, which was the duplicate of the one carried by the regular inspector, and left the store along with the suit and cloak department, where she told her story of having been sent to take the place of the regular inspector. The cashier, however, became suspicious, and refused to turn over the day's proceeds, which amounted to considerably over \$4,000.

The girl did not remonstrate, but saying that she would take along the schedule of the day's business, went to the other counters. The first inkling that any of the cashiers who had turned over their cash had that anything was wrong was when the regular inspector made the rounds.

U.E. LOYALISTS WANT OFFICIAL RECOGNITION.

Question to be Taken up With Dominion and British Governments.

Toronto, Nov. 7.—Under an order of council dated 1911, and issued by Lord Dufferin, all United Empire Loyalists were entitled to append the letters U.E.L. to their names on all official documents, and their descendants for ever more. At the present time, however, this form has fallen somewhat into disuse and a large number of unauthorized persons are making use of the letters, therefore it was suggested by Dr. Sterling Ryerson at a recent meeting of the U.E.L. that a royal warrant should be obtained confining the use of the distinction to the descendants of those who earned it by leaving their homes and venturing into the wilderness to uphold the united empire.

An address of welcome on behalf of the United Empire Loyalists is to be personally presented to his excellency, the Duke of Connaught, on the occasion of his visit to Toronto the latter part of this month. A committee to draft the address and make the necessary arrangements was formed. The association enthusiastically favored a suggestion that a fitting tribute to the memory of the late Right Hon. William Hamilton, who superintended the construction of the old Welland canal, would be to erect a monument.

GOLD REVEALED BY DREAM.

Couple Rewarded for Their Faith in Vision.

Oxford, Md., Nov. 7.—Wye Mills, a small village in Talbot county, is excited over the realization of a dream of buried treasure. Some gold has been found and with it directions for digging more. The dream came to Rachel Stansbury, a colored woman, at her home in Philadelphia, and was followed, she declares, by a visitation from her dead uncle, John Scott, who urged her to act upon the hint.

She and her husband, Emory Stansbury, went to the spot described in the dream, near their old home, at Wye Mills, and began digging. Three feet under the surface they found a box containing three gold tokens of irregular shape, each about the size of a silver quarter. In the box was a paper, falling to pieces from age, on which was written: "More money buried here deeper down. Dig fast and get it."

Stansbury and his wife are doing their best to "dig fast" and want help, but the negroes of the neighborhood are superstitious and will not approach the place.

CAUSED DEATH.

Aged Man is Killed by Fall From Barn.

Clayton, N.Y., Nov. 7.—While helping to build barn on the John Gurnsey place at Sand Bay, on Wednesday, William Winnill, aged seventy-one years, fell a distance of eighty feet and suffered injuries which caused his death that night. Mr. Winnill and Clarence Gurnsey were both on a staging up in the gable of the building when the staging gave way, Gurnsey escaping with a few bruises.

Drs. Buchanna and Vebber attended the injured man and found that his jaw, one arm and three ribs had been broken by the fall.

Mr. Winnill leaves a wife, who is a cripple, and two daughters, Mrs. J. Lee and Mrs. Frederick Shely.

WOMAN 101 REGISTERS.

Thinks She is "Old Enough to Vote."

Whittier, Cal., Nov. 7.—"I think I am old enough to vote," said Mrs. Lydia Head Sharpless, 91 years old, when, following her registration as a voter, she submitted to a brief interview. Mrs. Sharpless said that she was a Quaker, a prohibitionist and a progressive. She is the first woman to register in this district and claims to be the oldest voter, man or woman, in California.

Tabooed "Spoonng"—Expects to Live for at Least Another Ten Years.

Zanesville, Ohio, Nov. 7.—"I have never been kissed in the hundred years of my life," is the boast of Miss Rachel Bell, who celebrated to-day the hundredth anniversary of her birth. Miss Bell shyly hints that she had many opportunities in her comely youth, but just didn't. She said to-day:

"When I was a young girl I went to many parties and dances. We always had a good time, and it always went without any of what you call spooning in it. I had plenty of chances to marry, but could never find a man I loved, so have always remained single."

In recognition of the anniversary, neighbors for miles around Adamsville, Ohio, where Miss Bell was born, and where she now lives, gathered at her home, and one hundred farmers with shotguns fired one hundred shots, starting at eight o'clock in the morning, at which hour Miss Bell was born.

Miss Bell says she expects to live ten years longer.

STARVED HERSELF.

Aged Woman Had \$5,000 in the Bank, Though.

Dundee, Nov. 7.—A remarkable story has just come to light relating to the fate of an old retainer of a well-known, and highly-respected family.

A woman had acted in the capacity of housekeeper to the family for many years. Her long association with the various members of the household had endeared her to them, and they had come to look upon her as practically one of themselves.

As time went on, however, it was recognized by the head of the family that the housekeeper was beginning to feel the weight of years. In consequence arrangements were made for making her declining years comfortable. A cottage was bought for her in the suburbs, and no effort was spared to make things comfortable for the aged servant. In addition a generous sum was allowed her for sustenance from week to week.

Time passed, and the old retainer died. Investigations as to the cause of death led to the discovery that the old lady had practically succumbed to starvation. Naturally, the merchant who had made himself responsible for the old lady's welfare was deeply distressed at this unfortunate termination to a well-spent life, more especially in view of the sizeable sum at her disposal.

Closer inquiry into the affairs of the deceased woman has revealed the fact that there was over \$5,000 to her credit in the bank. It is now surmised that the poor woman, haunted by the fear that at some time she might be bereft of her benefactor and left to fend for herself, had starved herself of the necessities of life and had paid the penalty.

Efforts are now being made to trace any relatives who may be in existence and have a claim on the estate. So far, however, these have proved fruitless, and there is every likelihood of the money falling to the crown.

Postmaster's Salary Cut.

Niagara Falls, Nov. 7.—With Postmaster V. H. Robinson, of Niagara Falls South, post office wanting to throw up his job, because his salary was last month cut from \$1,600 to \$150 a year, the postal authorities are making every effort to find a successor for the man who is losing money by holding a government position. They are also having trouble in obtaining letter carriers, many postmen having resigned after a short trial at the work.
