Dissolution in Progress-Thirtyfour Subsidiary Companies Are to Go it Alone. New York, Nov. 17 .- The board of

directors of the Standard Oil company gave the finishing touches, yesterday, to the process of dissolution of that giant trust decreed by the supreme court of the United States The board voted unanimously for

the scheme of exchanging shares of the trust for shares of the thirtyfour subsidiary companies which con-stituted the combination declared to be illegal and in restraint of trade by the tribunal of last resort.

By this exchange the great com-bine is split into thirty-four parts, and, under the law of the land, none of these various parts hereafter is to be inter-related.

Each is to stand on its own bottom; each is to "go it alone" future; each is to have its - own board of directors and officers; each is to keep its own accounts and declare and dissribute its earnings to its stockholders none is hereafter to make reports to No. 26 Broadway -the euphonious name known around the world as the Standard Oil




