**MONK'S CONFESSION**

IT IS A VERY HUMILIATING EXPERIENCE.

Dodging Point and Cornered at Last—Evidence of a Shameful Deal—A Conservative Print Upon the Very Depressing Spectacle.

Mr. Monk, with smiling frontistry, declared in parliament, that there never had been any departure of policy between himself and Mr. Borden, a declaration that was received with liberal jeers an "Oh, Oh."

"When I was a boy," went on Mr. Monk—and his whole attitude was that of a school boy impudently trying to bluff a teacher who had reprimanded him for wrong doing—"when I was a boy I used to be emmoured of the circus."

There were loud roars of laughter and pounding on the desks on the liberal side, which were answered by conservative applause.

"but I have never witnessed such an exhibition of political somersaults as has been made by the liberal leader," concluded the minister unperturbed, which was received with more jeers.

The burden of Mr. Monk's explanation was that the original resolution unanimously adopted by the house on the naval question had come up during a period of panic "and the moment of danger is never the moment when any loyal British subject will refuse to do his duty." Under the circumstances he could not do anything but vote for the resolution.

It was pointed out by an interrupter that during the election the nationalist had declared that Mr. Monk had not voted for that resolution, and Hon. Mr. Lemaire quoted from a speech in the house by Mr. Monk, in which he repudiated that resolution.

"Did I understand my honorable friend to say he had voted for this resolution?" queried Sir Wilfrid.

"Yes, certainly, I adhered to it," replied the minister.

"You voted for it?" persisted Sir Wilfrid, amid continued liberal cheering.

"Certainly," responded Mr. Monk.

"You are satisfied of that?" Sir Wilfrid continued.

"Let me say in further answer that I was not present in the house when it was declared carried, but we remember the circumstances." (Liberal laughter.)

"And that was your defence to your fellow Nationalists in the country?"

"Let me say to the gentleman of the 'buttering-habit,'" exclaimed Mr. Monk, now nettled, "that the resolution after coming down—as the subject of confidence between the two leaders before it was declared carried, and by that time I had gone home and was in bed."

"Sir Wilfrid Laurier—'Hear, hear,' (loud renewed applause.)

"I was quite satisfied with its terms," persisted Mr. Monk, amid cries of "Oh."

**Talk to the People.**

The resolution, he said, was based upon suggestions made by the British admiralty at the imperial conference of 1907. The plan was that the British admiralty took charge of the supremacy of the sea and the control of trade routes. Canada was only to guard against any attack or raid on its own coast and to supply coaling stations and ports.

"No matter what you say," declared Mr. Monk warmly, "no matter what you call me, I was born and bred a liberal-conservative and I never varied in my allegiance to that party." (Roars of liberal laughter.)

"We have never taken any ground in Quebec in the campaign in the doctrine, call it what you like, that we preached, then that we were loyal subjects of the crown. We do not approve of this plan, nor of this navy. We use our right to criticize it. We insisted that it be submitted to the people and we pledge ourselves to accept the verdict of the people."

"We condemned the leaders on both sides, I admit it unreservedly," Mr. Monk proceeded. "We called for a submission of the issue to the people, and I am confident that the leader of the present government has taken the view of that question which was, in my opinion, the right one." (Liberal "hear, hear," and laughter.)

Continuing, Mr. Monk said that the Canadian navy was not fit to take part in the empire defence. He had been to Fort Monroe in the United States and had there learned that cruisers were no good for defence work. He and his colleagues had been accused of boarding the ship, which he had asked for a plebiscite upon the navy, but it should be remembered that this suggestion did not come from him first, but that it was proposed by Clarence Jameson, of Digby. Mr. Sinclair—"May I ask what type of navy the honorable minister favors?"

Mr. Monk—"That is a question which we will take into our consideration." (Liberal laughter.)

Mr. Sinclair pressed for an answer.

Mr. Monk replied that he was aware that the members for Guyaboro were to a certain extent a seaman, while he was not. But he did know that cruisers were no use as battleships and could not stand before heavily armed battleships.
