### IT WOULD COST MORE

To Relay Old Gas and Water Mains in One Trench.

In speaking of some criticisms that have been made regarding the renewals of sewer, gas and water pipes on Wellington and Sydenham streets not being laid in one trench, Superintendent Hewitt, of the water works, told a Whig representative today that in many cases it would cost a good deal more to put the pipes together than it would to renew them in their old places. Such was the case on Wellington and Sydenham streets, he stated, that for several years, the gas and water departments had been co-operating in the matter in main-laying, where new pipes were being put into streets not hitherto supplied. In such cases, one trench for all mains was the proper plan to follow. Even at the present time, arrangements are being made for further joint laying of mains, for instance on Kensington street. Superintendent Hewitt showed plans of some of the older blocks, where it was unwise to place renewals of mains in one excavation. It was difficult to get to the bottom, besides additional cost, to bring the mains together. The same applied also to many services which had to be renewed separately. As for sewer and water-pipe laying there had been joint laying for the past twenty years.
