In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acro. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acro. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.


