**DOMINION TRUST CO.**

Expands Its Business—Eastern Interests Represented.

For some days past negotiations have been under way with eastern capitalists with relation to the establishment of a branch of the Dominion Trust company, limited, in Montreal, and the managing director, W. R. Arnold, before leaving for Vancouver, announced that arrangements had been completed for considerable expansion of the company's operations. The Montreal directors include Messrs. Peter Lyall, Sr., William M. Birks, John Pitblado and D. W. Bole.

The Dominion Trust company, limited, has been in operation in Montreal under the subsidiary charter of the Dominion of Canada Trust company, with offices in the Quebec bank building. Application has been made to the federal government for general powers and for confirmation of the special powers granted by the province of Quebec, also to authorize the name of the name "Dominion Trust Company, Limited," under which name operations will hereafter be carried on.

A. S. Birchall, well-known in financial circles, has been appointed manager of the company for Montreal.

The Very Latest Pulled From All Over the World.

D. G. Darby, Winnipeg, broker, is dead.

Incendiary in New York set fire to all baby carriages he found outside houses.

Queen Victoria of Spain has given birth to her fifth child in five and one-half years.

St. George Reid, Australian high commissioner, is to pay a visit to Canada next year.

Dynamite, fuses, etc., found in a doorway of a laundry in Los Angeles. It caused a sensation.

Darrow, of Los Angeles, denies all knowledge of the alleged bribery, which a witness says Darrow was cognizant of.

Charles Cox, Niagara Falls, N.Y., hit a 2,280 volt electric current. He braced himself and freed himself without injury.

It is said that when a vacancy occurs in the lord lieutenantcy of Ireland it will be filled by Prince Arthur of Connaught.

The Canadian Pacific elevator, freight sheds and other buildings, at Owen Sound, were destroyed by fire. The loss is one million dollars.

J. A. Ellis, Ottawa, is to sue Gordon Henderson for platform slanders and Henderson is suing Auditor Cliff for similar tactics.

Quarman Page, 103 years old, of Chicago, the oldest "newsboy" in the United States, thinks he has sold papers long enough and is going to retire in January.

Eleven hundred people left Quebec, Royal George, on Thursday, to spend Christmas in the old land. Fifty per cent. were from west of Winnipeg.

The combined pack of the two "fish canning factories" at Port Townsend, Wash., for the season just ended, was 125,916 cases of salmon, valued at \$700,000.

**RUSSIA'S GRIP IN PERSIA.**

Latest Developments Blow to British Prestige.


