TWO CRIMINAL CASES

WERE HEARD BY HIS HONOR JUDGE PRICE

At Court of General Sessions of the Peace—James Esford Fined \$10 and Costs for Striking George Worthington.

Court of the general session of the peace was opened at the county court house, Tuesday afternoon, before Judge Price. The first case to be dealt with was that of the king vs. James Campbell, who was accused of stabbing Arthur Johnson, at Perth Road, some time ago.

The other criminal case was that of the king vs. James Esford, of the village of Barriefield, who was charged by George Worthington, also of Barriefield, with having assaulted him on April 30th, 1910.
