A CHANGE OF LIFE

A CHILD'S HEART ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE BODY.

Unusually Rare Case at Sick Children's Hospital—Little Two-day-old Girl's Abnormally-placed Organ Beating lustily.

Toronto, Dec. 11.—(One of the most remarkable freaks of nature imaginable is to be seen at the present moment in the Sick Children's hospital. A tiny baby girl, two days old, lies in a little white cot, with its heart beating like any ordinary child, but with this difference, that the heart is outside the thorax instead of inside.

By the aid of an ingenious mechanism its heart-beat was registered. A glass bell was placed over its heart and connected by a rubber tube to a lever which graphically recorded on a revolving drum, covered with smoked paper, even the most minute movements of the ectopic organ.
