Great Ship Canal. The Canadian trade commissioner at Manchester Mr. W. G. The bankers' clearing house returns for Manchester in the nine months ending September last amounted to the stupendous sum of \$1,215,000,000. No other city except London gets anywhere near these fig ures, and they are only \$215,000,000 short of the clearing house returns of Liverpool, Birmingham, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Bristol, Leicester and Nottingham all put together."



WEST LAND REGULATIONS. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE sead of a family or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, sor, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of

three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 across solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$2.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
