SNAP-SHOTING TIGERS IN THE INDIAN JUNGLE.

Richard Kearton Took Picture Records—He Tells of Some Close Calls He Had.

London, Dec. 26.—Richard Kearton, who has made a world-wide reputation by photographing birds and beasts in their native haunts, has just returned after a trip to India, where he has been engaged in taking cinematographs in the jungle of the wild animals, upon which King George is now testing his prowess as a shot.

"I went on my hands and knees along part of this tunnel, and found that one of the legs of the bullock had been newly eaten, so I returned and arranged a drive. With four hundred men, I cleared a space in the jungle fifteen feet wide, where the tiger was to be driven, put up a thin leaf screen to hide me from the beast, and waited on the ground, not up a tree, for him.

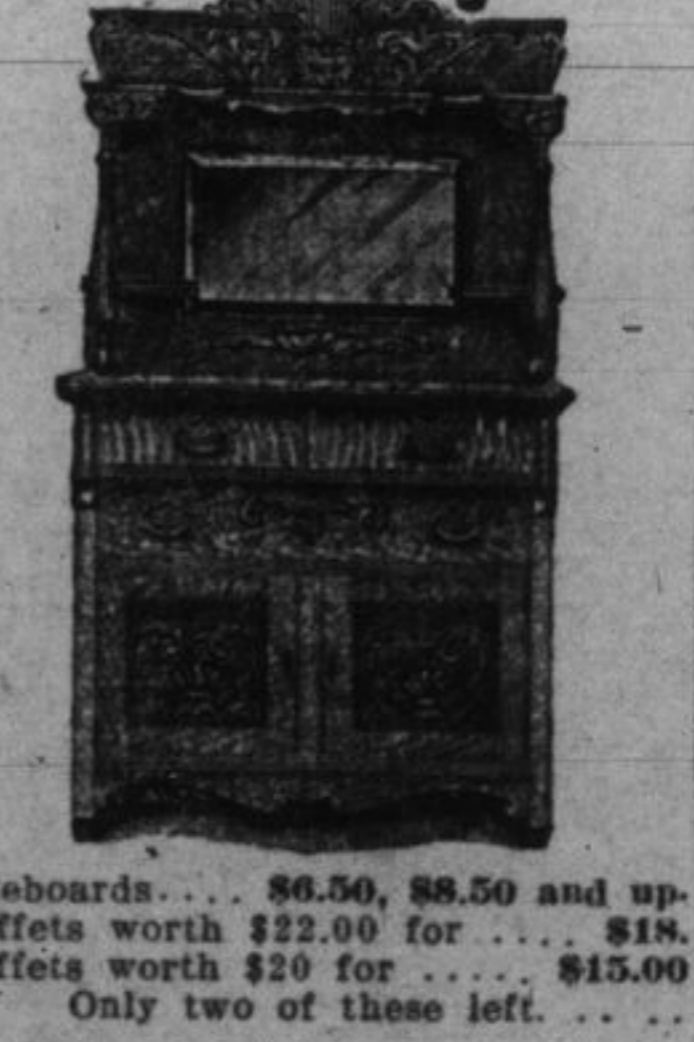
